



Silhouettes & Bird Groups Craft 7-8

Students receive a bird silhouette print out (or have them a silhouette on a blank piece of paper), identify its group, and create (draw, paint, use mixed media) a habitat around the silhouette that showcases the bird's adaptations and ecological role.



This example shows that the this bird is a passerine (I think this silhouette looks like an America Robin). I know that American Robins eat berries and are seed spreaders, so I have a berry bush in my habitat. American Robin's have 3 toes in front and one in the back for perching on branches so I included trees with branches.
